Coach Ramble to Castleton – Saturday June 9th 2018

Castleton is an ancient village in the High Peaks dominated by a medieval castle and surrounded by glorious hills making for excellent walking country. Once known for its lead mines, the old caverns are now tourist attractions. It is also known for the local mining of the semi-precious mineral Blue John. There will be time after walking to enjoy the village where there are plenty of places to shop, eat and drink.

CHOICE OF WALKS – *There are 2 led walks on offer with plenty of options for self-guided walks too.*

Walk 1. *Grade:* C+, strenuous – a scenic 11½ mile walk from the village of Bradwell to Castleton taking in many of the major local hills including Win Hill, Lose Hill and Mam Tor.

Walk 2. *Grade:* C, moderate with ascents – 7-8 mile walk with a fair amount of ascent. This offers views of Castleton and the surrounding hills.
